RABBI FUCHS REFLECTS



It is hard to believe that this is the last column for my first season as rabbi of *Bat Yam Temple of the Islands*.

The months seem to have flown by at warp speed. It feels like just last week Vickie and I arrived to find the island uninhabitable due to Hurricane Irma. Our trip to Florida had already been postponed twice.

We shared our first *Shabbat* celebration with our Fort Myers neighbors, Temple Beth El and Temple Judea in Fort Myers at the Federation building because none of our sanctuaries were usable. Rabbis Nicole Luna and Marc Sack were most gracious in welcoming me and the *Bat Yam* members present to participate in the service. **My lasting memory of that service was of the size of our delegation.**

Both Temple Judea and Beth El had to cancel their traditional *Selichot* services because their buildings could not be used, but even though Vickie and I had settled into our Sanibel home only that day, we welcomed

more than twenty congregants who came to join us there for our *Selichot* reflections and discussion.

Our High Holy Day services were special due to the music provided by our soloist Greg Watson and the exquisite *Yom Kippur* Congregants' Hour reflections of Tanya Hochschild, Lois Lorsch and Marcia Rudin. **Consensus was unanimous that Congregants' Hour should be an annual part of *Yom Kippur* at *Bat Yam*.**

For *Sukkot* we welcomed our hosts from Sanibel Congregational UCC, and Simchat Torah allowed us to journey the length of the *Torah* together.

In November, we welcomed the congregation's first ordained Cantor, Murray Simon. Working with a cantor of his talent, spirituality and reputation has been a great honor.

For our official installation we welcomed Rabbi Paul Citrin, a dear friend of both Cantor Simon and me for what proved to be a very special evening.

December brought a welcome return visit from *Bat Yam's* wonderful previous rabbi, Myra Soifer, who effectively connected her frustrations with Peace Corps red tape to the story of Joseph in Genesis. We are all thrilled that Rabbi Soifer at last has successfully launched this new chapter in her life.

Chanukah featured a joint evening of learning with Sanibel UCC in which we taught about *Chanukah* and we learned about advent and Christmas.

Rev. Dr. John Danner and I co-taught a well-received three-part series open to the public on “Tricksters and Troublemakers in the Bible.”

Thanks to Dr. Ellen Feingold, February featured a guest sermon by Rabbi Ronald Kronish, whom I met many years ago when we were among the first campers at Camp Eisner in 1958. Rabbi Kronish has spent his rabbinic career as an influential voice for interreligious understanding among Jews, Christians and Muslims in Israel.

***Purim* at Bat Yam struck a wonderful balance between frivolity and seriousness aided by the sparkling performances of Ben Yokel, Tanya Hochschild, Kathy Zoss, Edina Lessack and Cantor Pamela Siskin.**

March featured a magnificent “Great Cantors” program of music, learning and nostalgia presented by Cantor Simon. Later in the month, the renowned newscaster, Marvin Kalb,

thanks to his friendship with Herb Rubin, treated our community to a riveting address and the chance to purchase signed copies of his latest book.

Our community Seder, because of the efforts of Annette Pacyga, Sue Danford and their amazing committee, was a *tour-de-force* attended by 176 people!

Beyond the one-time events, though, every *Shabbat* at Bat Yam was special. I am moved by the warmth, graciousness and numbers of members who, with all that there is to do on this island, choose to come to services and classes.

Vickie and I bless the day you invited us to join you as part of the *Bat Yam* community, and we eagerly anticipate what next year will bring.

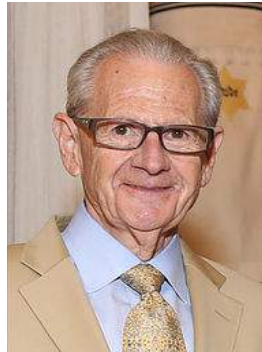

In *Who Created God? And Other Essays*, Rabbi Fuchs also discusses how Israel has evolved since its establishment in 1948, the intricacies and symbolism of the Jewish wedding ceremony, terrorism, and his reaction to encountering a swastika in an unlikely setting. According to Rabbi Fuchs, "God is a central focus and central force in my life, which is why so many of the essays in this book relate to the idea of God."
