SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE HUMAN TRAFFICKING PROGRAM

According to *Bat Yam's* Social Action Committee, Florida has the third highest incidence of human trafficking in the United States. Children as young as nine years old are victimized. These victims of labor and sex trafficking can be U.S. citizens or immigrants, female or male, children or adults. No one is immune from being targeted. On Thursday March 1st at 7 p.m., Nola Theiss, Executive Director of the Human Trafficking Awareness Partnership, will speak at 7 p.m. in Heron Hall of the SCUCC about what parents, grandparents, and community members can do to help prevent this crime.

RABBI FUCHS REFLECTS



Mishpatim, Fast Food, and our Responsibility to Farm Workers

Recently, members of *Bat Yam*, together with dozens of farm workers, interfaith leaders, and other committed individuals, demonstrated outside the Wendy's restaurant on Highway 41 in Ft. Myers. Our mission was to urge Wendy's management to join other food outlets as a participant in the Fair Food Program, which ensures a living wage and safe working conditions for farm workers in Immokalee, Florida, where 90% of the tomatoes consumed in the United States are grown.

As part of the demonstration, a few of us carried a letter detailing our request to the store manager, a young woman named Roween. When she met us at the door, her eyes filled with empathy for the workers marching just a few feet away, but she told us she is prohibited from accepting our letter. Although we knew, of course, that the ability to change Wendy's corporate policy was beyond her, we found her polite willingness to hear us out gratifying and hopeful.

Back home after the demonstration, I wanted to find someone who could, in fact, initiate change. With a little research, and I discovered that Wendy's board chairman, Nelson Peltz, is Jewish. I have tweeted him and written to him via Facebook about the importance of the Fair Food Program, which would cost Wendy's an additional one cent per pound for tomatoes harvested by Immokalee workers instead of from sweatshop farms in Mexico.

Over the course of a year, that increase would total \$4 million. As I continue to await his response, I have joined the cohort of demonstrators who take our fast-food cravings elsewhere, and urge everyone I know to do the same.

In the early February Torah portion, *Mishpatim*, we learn that we "shall not wrong or oppress a stranger, for [we] were strangers in the land of Egypt...if you do mistreat them, I will heed their outcry as soon as they cry out to Me..." (Exodus 22:20, 22). Just as God heard the cries of the Israelites, I am hopeful that Mr. Peltz will hear and feel the anguish of the Immokalee workers prompted by Wendy's refusal to participate in the Fair Food Program.

If it appears these efforts amount to little, let us remember the words of the second century sage, Rabbi Tarfon, a wealthy man who championed causes on behalf of the poor and disenfranchised. In response to the frustration we all feel in our struggles against injustice, Rabbi

Tarfon gave us a motto that reaches out across the millennia: "It is not incumbent on us to complete the task, but neither are we free to desist from it." (*Pirkei Avot 2:16*)

Today, as the stranger, the poor, the widow, and the orphan cry out to us with a sense of desperation more intense than any I have heard before, it is clear why the *Torah* tells us no less than thirty-six times – more than any other commandment – to stand up for the dignity of these people.

Even if we do not complete the sacred work of their redemption, we must never stop trying.

BAT YAM TO PARTICIPATE IN 2018 WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

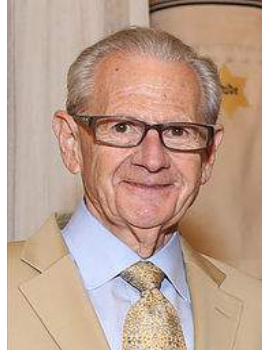
On Friday, March 2nd, *Bat Yam* will join for the first time in the Sanibel community's celebration of the worldwide ecumenical event The World Day of Prayer. The service, titled "All God's Creation is Very Good!", will be at 10 a.m. at St. Michael's and All Angels Church. The interfaith service will celebrate protection of the earth and will also honor the women of the South American country of Suriname. The main speaker will be Ms. Indrani Radakishun, whose family migrated to Suriname from India in the 1900s. She was born and raised in Suriname, then came to the U.S. in 1987 to attend the University of Florida in Gainesville where she earned a B.S. in Business Administration. She currently lives in Miami.

The service will be followed by refreshments featuring the foods of Suriname, cooked and provided by Ms. Radakishun and planning committee members. Attendees will also have a chance to meet the speaker and to learn about efficient methods of recycling.

RABBI FUCHS SPEAKS TO UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST SOCIETY

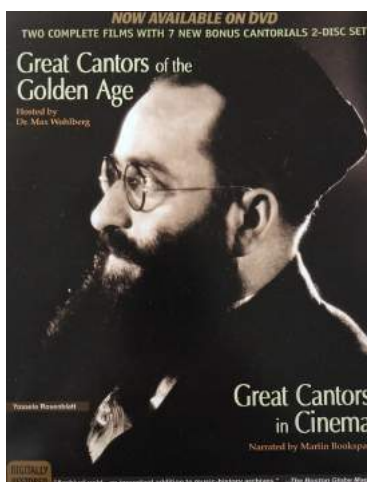

GREAT CANTORS OF THE GOLDEN AGE -- MARCH 11TH

On Sunday, March 11th at 3 p.m. in the sanctuary of the SCUCC, *Bat Yam's* Cantor Murray Simon will present a program featuring the showing of the acclaimed historic documentary DVDs that he produced, *Great Cantors of the Golden Age* and *Great Cantors In Cinema*. The program is presented in conjunction with The National Center for Jewish Film at Brandeis University.

Cantor Simon's DVDs are an historic film preservation of some of the most famous cantors of the so-called "Golden Age of *Hazzanut*" (cantorial art) from 1927 to 1956. They feature Cantors Mordechai Hershman, Adolph Katchko, Moshe Koussevitsky, Moishe Oysher, David Roitman, Yossele Rosenblatt, Joseph Shlisky, Gershon Sirota, and Leibele Waldman.

The DVDs have been aired at the Los Angeles Jewish Film Festival, the Toronto Jewish Music Festival, the New Jersey Jewish Film Festival, and the National Yiddish Book Center in Amherst, MA as well as in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem and many congregations in North America. They have garnered rave reviews including "Archival gold - an important addition to music-history archives," in *The Boston Globe Magazine*. The program is open to the public, free of charge. The DVDs will be available for purchase at a special price of \$36.00 for both.

Marvin Kalb will speak about his latest book, "The Year I was Peter the Great: 1956 - Khrushchev, Stalin's Ghost, and a Young American in Russia", on Sunday, March 25th at 3 p.m. in the sanctuary of the SCUCC. *Bat Yam* is sponsoring the program, which is open to the public, thanks to The Rosner Foundation In honor of June Rosner. Marvin Kalb is presently a nonresident senior fellow with the Foreign Policy program at Brookings and senior advisor at the Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting. He focuses on the impact of media on public policy and politics. He is also an expert in national security, with a focus on U.S. relations with Russia, Europe, and the Middle East. His other books include *Imperial Gamble: Putin, Ukraine and the New Cold War* (Brookings Institution Press, 2015), "The Road to War:

Presidential Commitments Honored and Betrayed" (Brookings Institution Press, 2013), in which he looks at how presidential commitments can lead to the use of American military force, and "Haunting Legacy: Vietnam and the American Presidency from Ford to Obama" (Brookings Institution Press, 2011), co-written with Deborah Kalb, which examines the Vietnam War's extraordinary impact on presidential decision making over the past four decades. Kalb's distinguished journalism career spans more than thirty years and includes award-winning reporting for both CBS and NBC News as chief diplomatic correspondent, Moscow bureau chief, and anchor of NBC's "Meet the Press." He went on to become founding director of Harvard University's Joan Shorenstein Center on the Press, Politics and Public Policy. He is the Murrow Professor Emeritus at Harvard and hosts "The Kalb Report" at the National Press Club. The book, published by Brookings Institution Press in October, 2017, will be available for purchase at the event.
