JANUARY 2018 BAT YAM SHABBAT MORNING CLASSES

The *Shabbat* morning classes begin with a half hour of Hebrew reading instruction taught by Rabbi Fuchs (with the exception of January 6th). They continue with Rabbi Fuchs' presentations according to the topic "Beginning with Creation in Genesis and Getting As Far As We Get as the Year Unfolds". Bat Yam congregants present the second session. The theme of these presentations for January will be Jews in Entertainment. The January Saturday morning class schedule is as follows:

January 6

- .9 to 10:30: *Torah* study based on *Parashat Shemot*: "Exodus & Jewish Identity" - Rabbi Paul Citrin (*Note: no Hebrew class that morning*)
- . 10:30 to 11:15: Introduction to the topic Jews in Entertainment: composers, actors, comedians movie producers, and others who brought Jewish entertainment to America – Edina Lessack

January 13

- .9 to 9:30: Hebrew reading - Rabbi Fuchs
- .9:30 to 10:15: Maestro Nir Kaberetti, Musical Director of the Southwest Florida Symphony Orchestra, will discuss his childhood and music studies, path from musical instrument to podium, why a conductor is necessary, Musical Director vs. Guest Conductor, and the relevance of music to our communities today
- .10:15 to 11:15: Conversations Starting with Genesis - Rabbi Fuchs
[Note the switch in time for the above two sessions]

January 20

- .9 to 9:30: Hebrew reading - Rabbi Fuchs
- .9:30 to 10:30: Conversations Starting with Genesis - Rabbi Fuchs
- .10:30 to 11:15: The Life and Times of Aaron Copland, Dean of American Music in the 20th Century. (May include audio excerpts from some of Copland's compositions that best exemplify his love of America.) - Barry Fulmer

January 27

- .9 to 9:30: Hebrew reading - Rabbi Fuchs
- .9:30 to 10:30: Conversations Starting with Genesis - Rabbi Fuchs
- .10:30 to 11:15: More Than Cantors (highlighting cantors who ventured outside of the synagogue into the realm of secular culture and music) – Cantor Simon

Rabbi Paul J. Citrin will officiate at the joint *Bat Yam* installation service of Rabbi Stephen Fuchs and Cantor Murray Simon at *Shabbat* services on Friday, January 5th at 7:30 pm. His sermon topic will be "The Keys to A Flourishing Congregation".

Rabbis Citrin and Fuchs were classmates in rabbinical school, and Rabbi Citrin shared a pulpit with Cantor Simon in Boston. A native of Los Angeles, Rabbi Citrin was ordained by the Hebrew Union College in 1973. He currently serves as the

rabbi of the Taos, NM Jewish Center and teaches classes at the Jewish Community Center of Greater Albuquerque and at other locations. He co-founded the Jewish-Catholic Dialogue of Albuquerque, which now includes Protestants and Muslims. He was also on the board of the Martin Luther King Multicultural Council, which provides college scholarships to minority students. He served as president of the Pacific Association of Reform Rabbis and as a board member of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. He is the author of the children's novel *Joseph's Wardrobe* and co-author and editor of several other books.

Rabbi Citrin will also present the rabbi's portion of the *Shabbat* morning class the following morning from 9 to 10:30, January 6th, *Torah* study based on Parashat *Shemot*: "Exodus and Jewish Identity". [Note there will be no Hebrew class that morning.]

His appearances during the installation weekend are sponsored by The Rosner Foundation in honor of June Rosner.

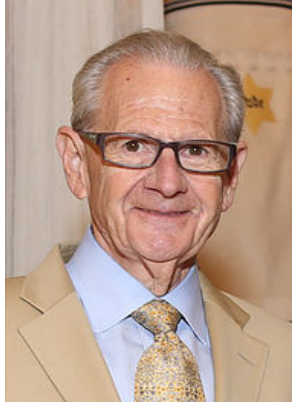

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Welcome to 2018, and warm wishes for a happy and healthy New Year. It is hard to believe we are celebrating the twenty-seventh birthday of our congregation this month. The time has flown by. Before we erase the memories of 2017, I want to use this opportunity to review our achievements and activities.

Last year, Rabbi Soifer created a *Tu B'Shevat* service, with a specially designed meal that was attended by over ninety people. Our Passover Seder, beautifully managed by co-chairs Annette Pacyga and Sue Danford, with Ann Arnoff (of blessed memory) and Miriam Bailey as mentors was a sellout.

Rabbi Soifer's decision to not renew her contract created a challenge. However, we were blessed by a distinguished nine-person committee headed by Lois Lorsch. Hundreds of hours and numerous phone calls, conferences and visits by three candidates led to the selection of our outstanding new Rabbi, Stephen Fuchs. Based on his suggestion, we started our season the week before

Rosh Hashanah with a *Selichot* service. Rather than letting Hurricane Irma damage to the UCC church interfere with plans, the rabbi and his wife, Vickie offered their home. Eighteen members participated in a memorable evening. Rabbi Fuchs stated that he wanted to perform Friday night services beginning after High Holidays instead of November, thus transforming our six-month format to eight months.

The resignation of Doug Renfroe led to another search. Greg Watson, a friend of Kathy Zoss, was contracted to sing for the High Holidays. Shortly thereafter we hired Cantor Murray Simon, who had an impressive forty-year career and was willing to drive from the Sarasota area each week. We are now blessed with an impressive duo working beautifully together and enriching our services with their ardor and passion.

Organizing *Tashlich* (observed immediately following *Rosh Hashanah* services), building a *Sukkah* and

planning a *Simchat Torah* celebration were all accomplished within very short time frames by an outstanding cadre of volunteers. It takes many people to “create a village”, often undertaking many tasks behind the scenes, such as finding people to host the *Onegs* (thanks Kathy), doing the setups and cleanups (thanks Cheryl and Barry), signing up members for the weekly honors, cooking or baking for a potluck, editing the bulletin and publicity (thanks Marcia and Cheryl) — these are the real heroes. My special thanks to our board of trustees and officers without whose support we would not exist. Also, many thanks to Garry Weiss and our Social Action committee, which is already making a difference, but needs more people to expand its activities.

During the course of the year, we are able to offer several educational programs that would not occur without the generous support of June Rosner and the Leo Rosner Foundation. Take a close look at the January activities on our calendar from the installation of our rabbi and cantor by Rabbi Paul Citrin (January 5) to our Saturday schedule of classes, which includes Nir Kabaretti, Musical Director of the Southwest Florida Symphony (January 13) and Cantor Simon (January 27). If you have not attended our classes, especially the hour led by Rabbi Fuchs, you are missing quite an experience.

Finishing up January, on the 28th, Bat Yam members led by Rabbi Fuchs will participate in the annual Heart Walk.

Moving ahead, on my wish list for 2018 are objectives like increasing membership, raising more funds for programming and involving more volunteers. Each and every one of you makes a difference, and I thank you for being part of the *Bat Yam* family.

REVEREND DANNER AND RABBI FUCHS OFFER THREE JOINT CLASSES IN JANUARY

On Wednesdays, January 10th, 17th and 24th at 10 a.m. and repeated at 7 p.m., Rabbi Stephen Fuchs and The Rev. Dr. John Danner, Senior Pastor of the SCUCC, will offer a series of courses titled "Tricksters and Troublemakers: Jewish and Christian Perspectives on Challenging Texts".

They will explore two Hebrew scripture texts and one from the New Testament that present particular difficulties in terms of the morality of the characters in each account. On January 10th, the topic will be Cain and Abel; on January 17th, the Dishonest Steward from the Gospel of Luke; and on January 24th, Jacob: Is this the One to Inherit the Covenant? Rabbi Fuchs and Reverend Danner will each expand on the various ways these texts can be understood in light of their own faith tradition.

SHARED SCHOLAR LECTURE AND LUNCHEON SEMINAR ON JANUARY 14 AND 16

On Sunday January 14th at 3 p.m., the 2018 Shared Scholar speaker, Reverend Dr. J. Clinton McCann, Evangelical Professor of Biblical Interpretation at Eden Seminary in St. Louis, will lecture in the sanctuary of the SCUCC. A reception in Fellowship Hall will follow. His topic is "The Psalms as Doorway to Interfaith Dialogue." The program is open to the public.

Dr. McCann will also offer a luncheon seminar in the UCC Fellowship Hall from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Tuesday, January 16th. He will be joined by composer and musician Richard Bruxvoort Colligan in an exploration of the ways peace and justice concerns are reflected in the Psalms and in other songs. Mr. Colligan is a 21st-century psalmist. He holds an MA in Theology and the Arts from United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities and is currently working toward a Doctor of Ministry from Eden Theological Seminary. This luncheon seminar is also open to the public with no admission fee, but you must sign up if you wish to attend by telephoning the UCC office at 239-472-0497 or by adding your name to the sign - up sheet at *Shabbat* services

Dr. McCann's research and writing focuses on the Psalms. A noted biblical scholar, his publications on the Psalms include *The Shape and Shaping of the Psalter* and *A Theological Introduction to the Book of Psalms: The Psalms as Torah*.

The Shared Scholar program is co- sponsored annually by *Bat Yam*, the SCUCC, St. Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church, First Church of Christ Scientist, and Captiva Chapel by the Sea. *Bat Yam's* sponsorship is provided by the Leo Rosner Foundation in honor of June Rosner.
